Chairperson of the Board, Carolynn Coy welcomed everyone and thanked them for attending our Wyoming Chapter of ARMA September General Meeting. Carolynn briefly shared information about our ARMA chapter and our monthly meetings and activities then started the movie, "Decade of Discovery". This movie is a documentary of events that took place at the White House and in U.S. Courts (circa. 2002-2012).

The film details the quest of government attorney Jason R. Baron, to find a better way to search White House e-mail. Baron is Co-Chair of the Information Governance Initiative and serves as Of Counsel in Drinker Biddle's Information Governance and eDiscovery practice. The documentary also tells the story of the late Richard G. Braman, the founder of The Sedona Conference and teacher who took a stand for civil justice on the electronic frontier, and includes comment from Judge Shindlin who presided over the Zubelake VS USB Warburg, a groundbreaking gender discrimination case dependent upon e-discovery.

Together, Baron and Braman sparked a revolution. "The Decade of Discovery" charts their 10-year journey, ultimately revealing the surprising truth they uncovered. The movie focuses on the growth and evolution of the e-discovery industry and follows computer scientists, e-discovery gurus and federal judges—true American heroes—who have advanced the tremendous progress made over the past decade in e-discovery practices.

"The Decade of Discovery" shines a light on the ever-changing world of records, law, and technology. The film highlights the collaboration between judges, IT pros and lawyers aiming to solve the problem of how to manage the large volumes of data (e-mail), brought on by the electronic age that has led to the introduction of advanced analytics into the practice of law.

When the movie ended, Carolynn again thanked everyone and closed the meeting at 12:55 p.m.
